Mayor Labbe and City Council,

The Planning Dept. will review the 2024 budget items below at Tuesday's meeting.

2024 Planning Dept. Budget

Notes on 2023:

- Current "2023 Actual" exceeded legal and engineering services due to multiple zoning and subdivision code updates and Railyard SIA enforcement, but most enforcement expenses should be recovered through drawing from the Railyard SIA escrow accounts.
- Have not spend all of budget for:
 - o code amendment consultants,
 - o Historic Preservation Commission, and
 - legal publications.

Salaries: \$237,840 - \$248,340 (not including benefits)

- Current staff: \$134,190
 - o Planning Director: \$134,190
- Proposed staff:
 - Planner I: \$55,000-\$65,000 (3/4 in 2024 = \$41,250 48,750)
 - Applying for DOLA Grant, requires 20% match.
 - Building Inspector II/Plans Examiner/or contracted services: \$72,000-\$78,000 (1/2 in 2024 = \$36,000 \$39,000)
- Boards: \$26,400
 - Planning and Zoning Commission: \$14,400 (no benefits)
 - HPC: \$12,000 (no benefits)
- Note: Check that salary taxes/benefits for additional staff and boards are calculating correctly.
