### **REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES**

**Call to order of regular meeting – 6:03 p.m.**

**Roll call** – all council was in attendance

**Approval of agenda –**

MPT Lauchner moved to approve, CM Gowing seconded, unanimous approval by council

**Housekeeping matters –**

M Labbe –

- Commissioner Marcella, applied for a 5304 Transportation Planning Grant for a feasibility study. The grant will require a \$10,000 match
- CARES Act – Lake County was awarded \$697,000, the county and the city will work together to decide how money should be distributed. Money must be used for COVID-19 related expenses.

CM Hill, pointed out a misspelling and asked that the word Sentences, be changed to Sentence

MPT Lauchner, moved to approve with recommended changes, CM Greene seconded, unanimous approval by council

**Tabor Opera House 2018 CTF Funds Request and Utility Bills –**

Mary Ann Graham-Best – Requested an open line of credit that would be reimbursed once the funding comes in.

Mayor Labbe – would suggest a contract that states a dollar amount and a timeframe for repayment

CM Greene moves to approve a line of credit for the Tabor Opera House, up to \$25,000, pending a contract delineating the particulars of that line of credit and agreement, Gowing seconded, unanimous approval by council.

**Peak Alliance –**

They work to negotiate healthcare coverage costs and there are currently about seven Colorado mountain communities currently enrolled in their program. Lake County has some of the highest healthcare costs in the State. Other communities are seeing reductions by as much as 40%. Peak Alliance has negotiated the agreement with St Vincent General Hospital, Rocky Mountain Family



Practice and Centura. Peak Alliance has asked LC Organizations to contribute \$25,000 to set up the program here, they have already received \$20,000 and are looking to the city and county to each contribute \$2500.

CM Gowing, moves to approve a \$2500 grant from the City of Leadville to cover expenses for the Peak Health Alliance, MPT Lauchner seconded, unanimous approval by council

MPT Lauchner, moves to approve the annual renewal on 06/16/2020 for Jem Dutch Acres dba Earls retail marijuana store located at 115 Harrison Avenue, Leadville, CO 80461, CM Gowing seconded, unanimous approval by council.

**Ordinance 4, Series 2020, Amending Title 8, Nuisance, Weeds, Junk and Garbage –**

M Labbe, moves to adopt Ordinance 4, Series 2020, an ordinance amending Title 8 of the Leadville Municipal Code concerning nuisances, weeds, junk and garbage, seconded, unanimous approval from council, on First Reading, CM Hill seconded, unanimous approval by council. Second Reading and Public Hearing will be held on July 7, 2020.

**Bud Elliott asked to speak with council –**

Elliott, requested three things he would like council to implement within the Police Dept.

- A ban the use of strangulation and any other neck restraints by officers
- A ban on high speed pursuits within the city
- To consider hiring a consultant who could assist the Police Chief with public comments

A Police Advisory Board and Systematic Racism Training were additional suggestions that were brought up.
