## CITY OF LEADVILLE, COLORADO RESOLUTION NO. 17 SERIES 2019

## A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEADVILLE RESCINDING RESOLUTION 20, SERIES 2018, ESTABLISHING THE CITY OF LEADVILLE AS THE REVIEWING ENTITY FOR PURPOSES OF C.R.S. § 39-22-514.5

- **WHEREAS**, the City of Leadville, Colorado ("City") adopted Resolution No. 20, Series of 2018 ("Resolution 20") on July 3, 2018 in order to establish the City, through the Leadville Historic Preservation Commission, as a reviewing entity for purposes of C.R.S. § 39-22-514.5; and
- **WHEREAS**, C.R.S. § 39-22-514.5 allows for entities such as the City to review projects that may be eligible for tax credits for qualified costs incurred in preservation of historic structures; and
- **WHEREAS**, following the adoption of Resolution 20, the City and its Historic Preservation Commission have had staffing challenges that prevent the review of such projects as contemplated by Resolution 20; and
- WHEREAS, the City Council desires to rescind Resolution 20 and allow the proper agency of the State of Colorado to take over the responsibilities of the reviewing agency under C.R.S. § 39-22-514.5 for qualified projects in Leadville until such time as the City is able to overcome its staffing challenges to act as the reviewing entity.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Leadville, Colorado as follows:
- **Section 1.** The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein by reference as findings and determinations of City Council.
- Section 2. Resolution 20, Series of 2018, is hereby rescinded and repealed in its entirety.
- <u>Section 3.</u> <u>Severability.</u> If any part, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Resolution is for any reason held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions.
- **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall take effect upon its adoption by the City Council.
